  - × (1) Global (no national boarders)
  - × (2) Rapid (not as climate change)
  - × (3) No Room to Escape (see Fukushima)
  - × (4) Volunteers can't stay beside with victims (who survives?)
- × But COVID-19 is SIMILAR to other natural disasters,
  - × (1) More damages on those who are weakened.
  - × (2) No expectation, no reason, no...
  - × (3) Should stay beside with victims
  - × (4) Insufficient understanding
