- How did you take care of the elderly people and people with disability, if it is hard to see them directly? Sent messages? Chat over SNS?
- Can we establish a model for future bio-hazard response?

Academic Questions, possibly related to practice

- Psychological responses/care
- Social Psychological issues
 - Prejudice
 - Do not have any and overcome.
 - expert knowledge vs. lay knowledge
 - **■** Do not use "Cluster", "Overshoot", "Lockdown" without translation.
 - attacking invisible enemy
 - Be afraid but in a proper way, but how?
 - solidarity via social network
 - ► Keep some distance from authoritarianism, dictatorship...

Academic Questions possibly related to practice

- hoarding behavior
 - How to persuade not to do?
- **■** Isolation, human-machine interaction
 - **■AI? Through network?**
- Culture, collective identities
- Philosophical What is this anyway? Spiritual response?
