


INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL AVOIDANCE

The study sample consisted of respondents 772 persons from Sri Lanka.








Agreement on the Statement: "Students who are studying in foreign countries must be allowed to come into Sri Lanka within next four weeks."



- Use of quantitative and qualitative methods to some extent.


Disadvantages


- Not a representative of the whole community. Hence, there are questions about the statistical inferences based on a nonrepresentative sample.
- Community seems to be getting bored with onli ne surveys as the quarantine period was over.


Conclusions

- Online community perception surveys could be an effective tool in obtaining community participation and engagement during Covid-19 Crisis.
- Its use especially during restricted movement could be much useful.
- Policy makers and professionals must pay attention to the community perceptions and preferences in addition to the technical correctness of interventions.
